OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

CAYLA ANDREWS • The College of New Jersey
Sophomore • Forward • Hackettstown, NJ/Hackettstown

Andrews becomes the fourth Lion this season to earn NJAC Offensive Player of the Week honors after scoring a pair of goals in two NCAA Tournament wins. She provided the game-winning goal in both victories, including wins over SUNY Cortland and Centre College. She scored with 45.8 seconds remaining to break a 1-1 tie against Cortland, and scored the opening goal in the Lions' 2-0 third round win over Centre. Andrews is up to 32 points on 13 goals and six assists this season to rank ninth among all NJAC players.



DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

CHRISTINA FABIANO • The College of New Jersey Senior • Goaltender • Wayne, NJ/Wayne Hills

Fabiano earns her third and TCNJ's fourth overall NJAC Defensive Player of the Week honor after posting a pair of victories in the NCAA Tournament. She made four saves in a 2-1 win over SUNY Cortland, and four more saves for a clean sheet in a 2-0 win over Centre College. The shutout of Centre was her sixth individual and eighth total shutout of the season. Fabiano, the NJAC Goaltender of the Year, leads the conference in shutouts and is second in both goals against average (0.93) and save percentage (.827).



ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

MEGAN HOUSER • Kean University Freshman • Goaltender • Reading, PA/Muhlenberg

Houser earns her third NJAC Rookie of the Week honor after anchoring the Kean defense in three NCAA Tournament games, including the first two NCAA wins in program history. She made a pair of saves in the Cougars' 2-1 overtime win over Juniata in the first round, and then stopped six shots in a 2-1 upset of fourth-ranked Christopher Newport. She made three more saves in a 2-0 loss to Franklin & Marshall in the round of eight. In total, Houser faced 26 shots and made 11 saves in the three tournament contests. The rookie leads the conference in goals against average (0.92).
