NJAC CLOSES OUT FOOTBALL SEASON

KEAN CAPTURES ITS FIRST POST-SEASON TITLE

The New Jersey Athletic Conference finished its 1994 football season on a high note with its third post-season championship in the last five years.

Kean College finished the season for the NJAC with a convincing 41-7 road victory over Frostburg (Md.) State University in the ECAC Division III Southwest Championship, the first football post-season triumph in the school's history.

Kean, the NJAC co-champions this season, led from start to finish against the Bobcats. The Cougars, making their second appearance in the ECAC Championships, took the lead for good on just the second play of the game when sophomore wide receiver KENDALL WILLIAMS (Englewood, N.J.) raced 64 yards on an end around play to put Kean on the scoreboard. Sophomore running back TRENELL SMITH (Paterson, N.J.), who rushed 28 times for 116 yards in being named the game's Most Valuable Player, then capped an 88-yard, 16play drive with a one-yard run to increase the lead to 14-0 in the first quarter. Kean made it 21-0 at halftime when senior quarterback MARK CUMMINGS (Cherry Hill, N.J.) hooked up with his first of two touchdown passes to senior wide reciever ANTHONY ROBINSON (Plainfield, N.J.) and later extended it to 27-0 in the third quarter off a fake field goal attempt. Kean, the NJAC's top defensive team and ranked 25th in the nation, held Frostburg State, which was averaging 34 points and 416 yards a game, to just 260 total yards on the day. The win also marked the second straight ECAC Southwest Championship won by an NJAC member school as Kean follows Montclair State, which defeated Dickinson College for the title a year ago, It's also the third ECAC title won by the NJAC in the last five years as Ramapo won the the ECAC South Championship in 1990. Kean finished on top of the NJAC standings with Trenton State College as both teams posted identical 3-1-1 Conference records following a 14-14 tie between the two schools in the final week of Conference play. It was the Cougars' second Conference title while Trenton State finishes first for a fifth time and the first since 1990. Kean's only other title came in 1987. Ironically, the only other time that Kean appeared in the ECAC Championship was in 1987, the year it won the NJAC crown. In that year, Kean fell to Franklin & Marshall College, 12-0, in the ECAC South Championship.
